"But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." Acts 1:8 NKJV

Most scholars and commentators agree that this verse does not mean we should focus our evangelistic efforts on the geographical city of Jerusalem or region of Samaria. But is meant to encourage us to start with where we live and continue to move outwards sharing what Jesus Christ has done in our lives.

For English Canada, I propose that our Samaria is the province of Quebec. They are physically close, but are quite different in culture and religion. And just like the ancient Jews and Samaritans, we don't always get along as we should. The population of Quebec is over 8 million, with less than 1% identifying as evangelical Christians. This officially makes the Quebecois an unreached people group. That is why we have worked so hard over the last several years to secure a license for a Christian radio station for our Quebec ministry affiliate Aujourd'hui l'Espoir. Praise the Lord, that license was granted on September 16th!

Now the real work begins. Our responsibility at Galcom is to provide and install all the broadcast and studio




THE PROBLEM IN QUEBEC:


Historically, *la belle province* was dominated by the Roman Catholic Church, but that is no longer true of Quebec today.

As late as 1957, almost nine in ten Quebecois attended church monthly. Today, fewer than 20 per cent do so. This secularization, one of the most rapid in history, dates back to a wide range of radical 1960s social changes known collectively as the Quiet Revolution. Quebec has ceased to be Catholic, and has replaced it with secularism: people identify as Catholic but do not attend or observe any tenets of the church whatsoever.



Today, the challenge for evangelicals in Quebec is not to evangelize a Catholic province, but convert an increasingly secular population that still thinks of Protestantism as an alien religion.





So how do we connect with this unreached people group, sitting amidst Canada? That's where Aujourd'hui l'Espoir (Hope for Today) comes in. Headquartered in Quebec, they aim to share the Gospel message through a variety of media outlets, including television, internet, and radio. Aujourd'hui l'Espoir sees their role as one of first-contact evangelism to those who know nothing of Jesus Christ. As people respond to their ministry, they then help those seekers connect with local churches to be more fully discipled.

THE SOLUTION FOR QUEBEC:



Aujourd'hui l'Espoir has now officially been granted a radio licence for Christian radio, spawning a new branch of the ministry, CJVI Radio Espoir 102.7 FM. Galcom has raised the funds for the radiostation equipment, but the ongoing annual operating costs for generating on-air programming, all original in Quebecois French, are overwhelming. Once on the air, the goal is to build dozens of rebroadcast stations throughout the province.







Needs for Radio Espoir

- 126 hours of diversified programs each week, including live call-in programs, Bible teaching, news & current events.
- 250 watts of power for broadcasting from Brownsburg, QC.
- Partner churches to operate rebroadcast stations
- Development of local talent such as musical groups, on-air personalities, and various expressions of Christian art, such as theatre, cinema, visual art, and literature
- Station Manager salary of \$40,000
- Part-time Technician salary of \$25,000
- Translator/Administrator salary of \$40,000
