Last spring, our founder Allan McGuirl retired after 50 years of vocational ministry service. One of the benefits of Allan being in a position so long is that he enabled Galcom to build strong relationships, both with our partners here in Canada supporting the work through prayer and finances, and our affiliates overseas broadcasting and distributing radios.

Recently, Galcom partners funded a third radio station for our friends in Colombia, Pastors Davide and Alvaro. They are believers from the Guambiano people group, who are using Long-term partnerships allow us to develop better understanding of needs and priorities; our ministry affiliates help us grasp the cultural nuances and learn the best ways to help contextualize the Gospel message. They allow us to measure, over time, the impact we are having as we all serve together in the Great Commission.

This desire for long-term relationships doesn't end with our affiliates around the world. We have a saying here at Galcom, "We don't have donors, we have partners." We cannot thank

radio to reach not only their own people, but are targeting neighboring indigenous groups with this new station. Allan and a team from Canada installed the first station for them in 1995, almost 30 years ago! Since then, they have faithfully preached the Word of God in their mother tongue, blanketing the entire region where the Guambiano live. I've said many times that radio is the most efficient way to share the Gospel: just a few people with the right equipment are reaching the entire 8,000 Guambiano people, and now going outside their borders.

The story of the Guambiano people of Colombia is both heartbreaking and inspiring. They live in the northwest, where the Andes mountains split into three ranges and their land is surrounded by huge volcanoes and mountain peaks. Before the Spanish colonization there were 179,000 Guambianos; they lived on 9,216,989 hectares of land. The Spanish took all but 18,000 hectares; only 70 members of the entire Guambiano people survived the conquest.

Disenfranchised and hopeless, the Guambianos turned to alcoholism. They were also exploited by the cocaine cartels and forced into farming illicit crops.

But in 1932, the missionaries arrived. They began to translate the Bible into Guambiano, and started schools where the children learned to read and write by using the New Testament in their language.

To further reach this indigenous group, Ruth Ruibal, a Colombian missionary, connected them with Allan McGuirl. He took a Galcom team down in 1995 to install the first radio station, at the site of the first evangelical school.

"The Guambianos are a very small people; even the men are barely over five feet tall. But man, do they know how to work!" Allan says. The first station was completed quickly and began to broadcast throughout the Guambiano region. It was so successful that friends of Galcom funded a second station in 2011 at Huila, to reach even more of the people.

In 2022, the evangelical Guambianos approached Galcom with an amazing proposal: they wanted to install a third station, but this one would be aimed towards the Páez community beside them. Pastors Davide and Alvaro are passionate about sharing the Gospel they have been given with their neighbors. It is wonderful testimony to the hundredfold harvest your partnership with Galcom brings!


